The Turkish LPG Market

Turkiye consumes over 4.5 million metric tonnes (m mt) of LPG a year. Most of it (3.5m mt) is consumed in the transport sector making Turkiye one of the largest Autogas markets in the world with over 4.8m vehicles running on LPG.

The country's refineries produce over 1m mt of LPG a year with the remainder being imported.

The country boasts a per capita consumption of nearly 10kg/year.

The Turkish LPG Market in Figures



Total of 4.5 million metric tonnes (m mt) of LPG consumed each year



Approximately 50 m cylinders in the domestic market



800,000 mt/yr of LPG consumed in the domestic sector



4.8 million (m) vehicles running on LPG consuming 3.5m mt/year



Over 10,000 Autogas stations



1m mt/year of refinery produced LPG and 3.5m mt of LPG imported each year

About the destination

Turkiye is located at the crossroads of Southeastern Europe and Southwestern Asia.

Turkïye's land area spans over 769,632 square km (slightly larger than Texas) and has a population of over 84 million making it the 18th largest country in the world.

The country has an industrialising economy that maintains a large agricultural base. Istanbul, the largest city in Turkïye, is the link between Europe and Asia. It is the country's economic, cultural and historic capital with a population of over 15 million residents.

In 2024, Euromonitor International ranked Istanbul as the second most visited city in the world, welcoming 23 million visitors.

The historic centre of Istanbul is a UNESCO World Heritage Site, and the city hosts the headquarters of numerous Turkish companies, accounting for more than thirty percent of the country's economy.
